

BY-LAWS

MIDWEST SHRINE MOTOR CORPS

ARTICLE I

NAME:

The name of this organization shall be: Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association.

ARTICLE II

OBJECTIVES: The objectives of this organization are:

To promote this organization and the betterment of performance and competition.

To promote Shriners Hospitals for Children (Shriners Childrens).

To promote the Shrine in our fifteen Shrine Centers across the upper midwestern United States and Southern Canada.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. Elective Officers: The elective officers of the Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association shall be: President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, and Secretary/Treasurer.

The elective presidents shall be nominated from the host temple of the Midwest Shrine Association and will be installed at the annual banquet meeting.

The elective Secretary/Treasurer shall be nominated from the Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association membership and installed at the annual banquet meeting.

Section 2. The appointment of the Director of Judges and Director of Public Information and Social Media is made by the executive committee.

Section 3. The executive committee consists of the President and four Vice-Presidents. The Secretary/Treasurer and the Director of Judges will attend. The executive committee shall meet at MSA winter session and MSA summer session. A quorum for the transaction of business at any executive committee meeting shall consist of three members.

Section 4. Duties of Officers.

- The President shall preside over all meetings. The President is the main voice and contact person for hosting Midwest Shrine Motor Corps events. The President coordinates all events and delegates responsibilities to his officers and other helpers.
- In the absence of the President the next officer in line shall perform all the duties of the President. If the President becomes permanently incapacitated so as to prevent his performance of the duties of his office or should the office become vacated the next officer in line shall assume and perform the duties of the President until the executive committee appoints a new President.
- The First Vice-President is responsible for bringing the assistant chief judge and three other people to assist with the obstacle course and slow moving course. These are the people who will be in charge of these events at the next year host temple.
- The Secretary/Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association and shall place them in a depository as designated by the executive committee. He shall draw and sign checks on the MSMCA account. At the winter and at the summer meeting he shall make a full and complete financial report for the proper period of time. He shall be a regular non-voting member of the executive committee.
- The Director of Judges shall be an advisor and organizer of judges. He is appointed by the executive committee. He shall attend executive committee and Captains meetings.
- Director of Public Information and Social Media is responsible for MSMCA creating, administering and maintaining the MSMCA website and social media presences. Furthermore, the Director of Public Information and Social Media shall provide the Secretary/Treasurer and at least one other tech savvy member of the MSMCA with administrative access to all MSMCA Web/Social Media sites/accounts.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

The Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association shall have a winter executive and captain meeting with the date set by MSA winter meetings schedule.

The Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association shall have a summer executive meeting, Captains meeting, Judges meeting and banquet meeting set by MSA summer meeting schedule.

At the Captains meetings each unit has one vote. A quorum for transaction of business at a Captains meeting shall consist of two officers from the executive committee and three unit Captains or a designee of a unit to vote.

ARTICLE V

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Section 1. Type of Membership. A regular member is one in good standing with his temple and pays yearly dues. This can be by unit or individual. A life membership is given out by the executive committee to Past Presidents or others as they deem deserving.

Section 2. All members must pay dues including officers. The only exclusion is a life member does not pay dues.

Section 3. Dues to be set by Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association membership.

ARTICLE VI

RULES AND REGULATIONS

To amend the rules and regulations: The suggested change must be made in writing and presented to the executive committee. The executive committee will present the suggested change to the Captains meeting for a reading and discussion. The vote on the change would take place at the next scheduled Captains meeting.

ARTICLE VII

The cost of putting on a Midwest Shrine Motor Corps event is the responsibility of the host temple motorized units. The exception is the Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association will pay for trophies.

ARTICLE VIII

UNIT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Be able to assist to set up the competition field.
- Help develop the Midwest motorized vehicle experience.
- Help develop interest from all the motorized units.
- Should meet with all motorized units in their shrine to promote Midwest participation.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a proposition therefor presented in writing at, and approved by, one stated meeting of this Midwest Shrine Motor Corps Association, by a two-thirds vote of the unit Captains present thereat, published in the meeting minutes of that Stated Meeting.




